public hearing is now open. It's 3:30 p.m. My name is Susan Langdon. I'm the Executive Director of the Niagara County Industrial Development Agency.

I have been designated by the Agency to be the

hearing officer to conduct this public hearing.

We are here to hold the public hearing on Somerset Operating Company, LLC and/or individuals or affiliates, subsidiaries or entities formed, or to be formed, on its behalf. The transcript of this hearing will be reviewed and considered by the Agency in determination of this project. Notice of this hearing appeared in the Niagara Gazette on June 15, 2018.

Somerset Operating Company, LLC, for itself or on behalf of an entity formed, or to be formed, has requested the Agency's assistance with respect to a certain project consisting of:

(A) the acquisition or retention by the Agency of fee title to, or a leasehold interest in, an approximately 1,800-acre parcel of land located at 7725 Lake Road in the Town of Somerset, Niagara County, New York, together with the existing nine

buildings thereon. The Agency has previously provided financial assistance to the Company for qualifying portions of the Project consisting of partial real property tax abatement in the form of a certain payment-in-lieu-of-tax agreement.

Pursuant to the Company's request to extend the term of the existing PILOT, the Agency will consider acquiring or retaining title to, or a leasehold interest in, the Facility and lease the Facility back to the Company. The Company will operate the Facility during the term of the lease. At the end of the lease term, the Company will purchase the Facility from the Agency, or if the Agency holds a leasehold interest, the leasehold interest will be terminated. The Agency contemplates that it will provide financial assistance to the Company for qualifying portions of the Project consisting of an extension of the existing PILOT between the Company and the Agency.

The total PILOT Agreement payment to be paid by the Company for the County of Niagara and the Town of Somerset for the tax year 2019, and the Barker Central School District for the tax year

2018-2019, shall be three million dollars.

The total PILOT Agreement payment to be paid by the Company for the County of Niagara and the Town of Somerset for the tax year 2020, and the Barker Central School District for the tax year 2019-2020, shall be three million dollars.

Niagara County shall continue to receive 31.5 percent of the PILOT payment, the Town of Somerset shall continue to receive 9.25 percent, and the Barker Central School District shall continue to receive 59.25 percent.

Niagara County shall continue to pay for its Special Districts from its portion of the PILOT payment, and the Town of Somerset shall continue to pay for its Special Districts from its portion of the PILOT payment.

Okay. 10 Could you, for MS. LANGDON: 11 the record, state your name and address? 12 Joseph J. Fox, JOSEPH FOX: 13 9125 Somerset Drive, Barker, New York 14012. 14 Since the last PILOT for this 15 facility, employment at the facility has decreased 16 from ninety-nine to seventy-eight employees, a loss 17 of twenty-one jobs. The PILOT will increase from 18 four point one two million to three million, a loss 19 of one point one two million dollars. 20 Also, it must be noted that the 21 overall assessment for this facility has decreased 22

from four hundred and sixty-six million to one

hundred and thirty point seven million. Most likely 1 what the facility was paid for. This is a decrease 2 3 of three hundred and thirty-five point three million 4 dollars of assessed valuation. My source is the 5 Town Assessor of Somerset. Having said this, I oppose this 6 PILOT, and the plant should be put on the tax rolls 7 8 because of the major decrease in assessment. No other business or resident ever received a 9 seventy-two percent decrease, unless their 10 facilities burned down or whatever. 11 However, if the owners would 12 13 implement a total re-use of this facility with a solid proposal in hand, and implement a site plan 14 and action plan, then the PILOT might be warranted. 15 Otherwise, you're trying to beat a dead horse. 16 In the end, only the free market 17 and the owners will close the coal-fired plant. 18 19 That's it. MS. LANGDON: Thank you. 20 21 Does anybody else wish to speak? Sir.

JIM HOFFMAN:

I have a

payment-in-lieu-of-taxes. I have long advocated against these devices as unnecessary tax breaks.

I support the proposed

However, under the existing circumstances, the proposed PILOT seems the only practical option available to preserve the seventy-eight jobs and the attendant economic benefit of the area.

The plant is virtually worthless on the market, as coal plants are. So addressing assessed valuation is kind of academic, and I think the Town Board has been through that exercise as recently as a few months ago.

Unfortunately, the proposed PILOT has a length of only two years, as our senseless State energy policies are intent on closing the Somerset Operating Company and throwing away these seventy-eight jobs. This leaves Somerset and Niagara County with abandoned buildings, a pile of rusting steel, and a secured toxic landfill that must be monitored and maintained forever.

This begs the question to plant management, the IDA, and local leaders and politicians; what is next for this plant and the

1 community. Some say Lighthouse Wind proposed by 2 Apex Clean Energy, who plan to put maybe seven hundred -- or seventy-six hundred foot high wind 3 turbines on Lake Ontario's shores is the answer. 4 Nothing could be farther from the truth. Our local 5 residents, with much support on all levels, have 6 soundly rejected this proposal as a physical, 7 environmental and economic disaster for our 8 - 9 community. So what's next for the facility? 10 11 I, and many others, would like to know. I believe we need some answers from the Somerset Operating 12 Company, from Niagara County IDA, and from local 13 politicians. We deserve to hear from them more than 14 when it's just tax time. Thank you. 15 MS. LANGDON: Thank you. 16 Does anybody else wish to speak? 17 Sir, your name? 18 PAUL OLIVEIRA: Paul Oliveira, 19 8661 Huntington Beach, Barker, New York 14012. 20 You said something about a lease 21 of land that's right next to the plant, is that 22

No. That's 1 MS. LANGDON: 2 just the legal term for the leaseback, where the property goes off the tax rolls through a lease 3 agreement with the IDA. It's not really a lease of 4 the land, it's a conduit to get the tax benefits for 5 6 the company. That's PAUL OLIVEIRA: Okay. 7 all I wanted to know. 8 MS. LANGDON: Thank you. 9 10 Anybody else wish to speak? Ma'am. Betty Wolanyk, 11 BETTY WOLANYK: 7792 Haight Road. 12 First, I have a question. 13 Section Five where it says special district, what 14 is that funding for? Special district, what is 15 16 special district? Well, those MS. LANGDON: 17 are assessments that exist for -- I don't know the 18 specific -- but water districts or sewer districts. 19 I would defer to the Town. But those are never 20 abated, so they're included in the three million 21 22 dollars. Thank you. BETTY WOLANYK: 23

Every time the Somerset Power Plant fires up, I feel like cheering. It's a reliable, on-demand electricity producer, quite unlike the proposed industrial wind turbines that have been proposed, or will be proposed for this town.

Even with this minimal operation of the plant, the PILOT is almost twice what is proposed for Lighthouse Winds, which will be split between two towns, two school districts and two counties.

I'm in favor of continuing this PILOT, as I am in favor of this plant continuing operation and being a backup to all of the intermittent wind turbines that are being planted around New York State.

I am against Lighthouse Winds. I don't feel as though it's a reliable source of electricity. And I think that New York is jeopardizing its future, and will be raising its electricity rates to levels that will really see our economy fail in this state.

I, too, am concerned about the closing of the plant and whether we will be left

with a rusting hulk on the shore of Lake Ontario. 1 When we moved here in 1971 we could access the lake 2 right there, and we used to go swimming after we 3 would make hay on the farm. I realize it will never 4 be returned to what it once was. 5 But it concerns me that it's going 6 to be just left there abandoned because our governor 7 chooses to enforce regulations that make the power 8 plant inoperable, and instead, will force industrial 9 wind turbines down our throats. 10 I, too, believe we need some 11 answers, and we need a state that will be more 12 concerned about its citizens than whether its 13 governor is going to run for president or not. 14 MS. LANGDON: Thank you. 15 Does anybody else wish to speak? 16 PAUL OLIVEIRA: Is it possible 17 to find out -- I'd like to know how much that power 18 19 plant makes. Is there any way I can find that out from the IDA? 20 Not through MS. LANGDON: 21 the IDA, no. I don't know if you can find it online 22
