NiGen has completed most of the retrofit work and has brought in 27 permanent jobs. NiGen is now in a position to provide permanent financing on the facility through a bond financing. This financing will provide capital to finish the ongoing retrofit and provide adequate debt reserves for operations. A new Single Purpose Entity wholly owned NiGen's Owner, Sterling Energy Group, Inc. will be created for the purpose of this bond offering.
