Prior to being granted the community charter by the federal government (National Credit Union Administration), we served the employees of approximately 50 area businesses. We continue to serve these members.
	7.	Provide a brief description of the company and its history. Chartered by the federal government in June 1953 originally to serve the employees of Hooker Chemical Company, now Occidental Chemical Corporation. In 1982, we were granted the option to develop relationships with area businesses unable to form their own credit union (known as Select Employer Groups). In 2002, the National Credit Union Administration granted us a charter change to serve the underserved area of Niagara Falls. We were the first credit union in WNY to be

granted this type of charter. In 2003, we applied for, and was granted a Community Charter to serve anyone who lives, works, worships, volunteers, or attends school in the County of Niagara.
