8.0 New Business

8.1 NFNY Hotel Management, LLC (DiCienzo Waterpark)

Ms. Langdon stated that the project consists of the construction of a 150,000 square foot, 2-story indoor waterpark on a vacant lot adjacent to the Sheraton at the Falls Hotel on Third Street in Niagara Falls. This family-oriented attraction will draw tourists to Niagara Falls all year round. Mr. DiCienzo told the Board Members how the waterpark will draw tourism to the falls and keep the tourists there longer than they normally would stay.

The company currently operates the Sheraton at the Falls Hotel and the Days Inn in the City of Niagara Falls. Both properties have undergone major renovations and improvements within the past few years.

The company is requesting a twelve (12) year property tax abatement and sales tax abatement. Forty (40) full time new jobs will be created.

8.1 NFNY Hotel Management, LLC Continued

8.1.2 Authorize Public Hearing

Mayor Pappas motioned to authorize the Public Hearing; Mr. Ross seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

8.2 Sanborn Distillery Corp.

Ms. Langdon stated that Leon Safir plans to construct a 7,000 square foot building on a 2.8 acre lot located in Vantage Park. This parcel represents the last property that is not privately owned within the Park. The company will blend and bottle alcoholic beverages including vodka, whiskey and gin.

Mr. Safir currently has a facility in Toronto for the blending and bottling of alcoholic beverages. Mr. Safir spoke to the Board Members and stated that a U.S. location will allow his company to serve the American market, which makes up the largest percentage of his business.

The company is requesting a fifteen (15) year property tax abatement and sales tax abatement. Six (6) new jobs will be created at the onset.

8.2.2 Authorize Public Hearing

Mayor Pappas motioned to authorize the Public Hearing; Mr. Ross seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

8.3 CRS Truck & Trailer Service, Inc.

CRS Truck & Trailer Service offers a full service facility for truck and trailer maintenance and repair. The company also has a tank wash facility that is equipped to handle most materials. Small tote (350-750 gallons) cleaning is one of the company's niche markets. These totes often times contain hazardous materials and CRS washes, refurbishes, inspects and returns the totes to service.

The company needs to establish an on-site waste water treatment plant, boiler system and compressor air system, and the expansion will also entail the construction of a 1,600 square foot addition to the existing building to house specific tote wash equipment.

Anthony Santarosa spoke to the Board Members about the company and its need for the Agency incentives for them to accomplish their goals. The company is requesting a fifteen (15) year property tax abatement, mortgage recording tax abatement, and sales tax abatements.

Eight (8) full-time jobs will be retained and three (3) new full-time jobs created.
