After discussion, the Committee had agreed to table the request pending further information regarding the project.

Ms. Sara Capen, Executive Director, was present at today's meeting to answer any questions the Committee may have. The initial funding request was reduced to \$25,500.00 which represents twenty percent (20%) of the project costs.

The company, at the September 25, 2017 meeting, had previously requested \$284,492.00 to be used toward equipment, more specifically a jellyfish exhibit and hands-on opportunity exhibits. Total project costs are expected to be approximately \$355,615.00.

There was discussion that the Aquarium of Niagara would only be entitled to \$88,147 which is 20% of total project costs.

6.2 Niagara Arts & Cultural Center

The project involves the restoration of the 1,000 seat Grand Theater currently located on Pine Street in Niagara Falls, New York. The principals feel that the facility will contribute to the area's cultural investment and to its economic growth by providing new and diverse forms of entertainment to the area residents and thus encouraging tourism to the region.

Kathie Kudela, the Executive Director of the company, spoke at length to the Committee Members about the project and that the project plan is to restore the historic theater space to its original grandeur while integrating the equipment, technology, & support spaces necessary to transform a classic theater space into a venue suitable hosting live productions. Ms. Kudela also stated that the renovation will be a turning point in the revival of the Pine Avenue Corridor.

The company is requesting a grant of \$420,000.00; total project costs are approximately \$2.3 million dollars.

Subsequent to further discussion, Senator Ortt motioned to consider the grant request; Mr. Onesi seconded the motion. The motion failed.
