## 5.0 Unfinished Business

There was no unfinished business at this time.

#### 6.0 New Business

Included in the agenda packet was a summary of the background of the fund, eligibility criteria for projects, and a revised and condensed version of the original application for the reimbursable grants.

The funds were allocated from New York State to the NCIDA, and the Agency established the grant fund for the purpose of fostering economic development in the downtown core of the City of Niagara Falls. There are some general use statements, along with specific restrictions, but the use of money is truly at the discretion of the NCIDA. The decision was made to use the money as "Reimbursable Grant Funds" whereas funds will not be released until the project is completed and proof of expenditures are prepared.

## 6.1 Renaming of Fund

The committee members discussed shortening the name of the fund from the "Niagara Falls Tourism Target Zone Fund" to the "Cataract Tourism Fund."

Mr. Onesi motioned to approve the new name; Mr. Brown seconded the motion. The motion passed.

# 6.2 Amendment of Grant Terms for For-Profit Businesses

Eligible projects are investments that support increased tourism traffic in Downtown Niagara Falls. The program will be focused on projects located within a one-mile radius of the casino outside the Seneca Niagara Casino footprint. Projects may also be considered that lie within a two-mile radius of the casino.

Project applicants must submit a program application which then goes on the Committee's Meeting Agenda before a recommendation is made to the full NCIDA Board at the monthly Board Meeting.

There was a cap amount for each project, amounting up to 10% of the total project investment for for-profit companies. At this time, Assemblyman Morinello suggested that the cap be raised to up to 15% of total project costs for for-profit companies. For not-for-profits, the award may be up to 20% of total project costs. Grants will be pro rata to the amount of investment made.

# *Mr.* Brady motioned to amend the grant terms for for-profit businesses: Senator Ortt seconded the motion. The motion passed.

The question of the amendment of the grant terms raising the percent for for-profits to up to 15% going forward was duly put to a vote on roll call, which resulted as follows:

#### 6.4 **Reimbursable Grant Requests**

#### 6.4.1 Niagara Falls Center for Tourism

The company is requesting a \$1,000,000 reimbursable grant from the fund to be used toward a family entertainment center, a rope course, and an arcade. There will also be improvements and additions to outdoor tourism, retail and food and beverage facilities, improved landscape and pedestrian and parking facilities. Currently there are 20 full time jobs, 8 part-time, with plans on hiring 13 more within 2 years.

Paul Grenga gave a brief summarization of the project, and the company representatives subsequently left the meeting. Total project costs are approximately \$14,400,000 and the estimated completion date is May 2021.

After further discussion, Mr. Brown made a motion to approve the grant request of \$1,000,000; Mr. Ross seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
